## **WRIGHT, REAMY-JOHNSON, AUSTRENG AND CATCHPOLE CAPTAIN MDUSBC ALL-CITY TEAMS**

The Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) has named their All City teams for the 2022-2023 season.

The teams include men's, women's, senior men's and senior women's teams based on tournament and league performance from August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023. A complete list of criteria is available at [mdusbc.com](http://mdusbc.com).

Anthony Wright of Redford captains the men's team, while Brandie Reamy-Johnson of Taylor, Jeffrey Austreng of Waterford and Teresa Catchpole of Macomb captain the women's, senior men's and senior women's teams respectively.

Wright earned 72 points from being third in MDUSBC Open Doubles with CJ Harris III, ninth from MDUSBC in Michigan State USBC Open Doubles with Christopher Dunson, first from MDUSBC in Michigan State USBC Open All-Events, sixth in the MDUSBC Masters event and earned the Men's Series Cup for the 2022-23 season. A high average of 222, two 300 games and one 800 series complete his resume. This marks the first time Wright has appeared on the team.

Rounding out the men's first team are Charles Easton of Sylvania, Ohio (66), CJ Harris III of Dearborn Heights (66), Ryan Nelson of Harrison Twp. (65) and Charles Zelechowski of Westland (65).

Easton finished fourth in MDUSBC Open Doubles with Jeffrey Austreng, third from MDUSBC in USBC Open Doubles, first from MDUSBC in the USBC Open All-Events and tenth in MDUSBC Masters. One 300 game, two 800 series and a high average of 238 completed his resume. This marks his second time on the prestigious team.

Harris III was third in MDUSBC Open Doubles with Wright, In addition, he had four 300 games, five 800 series and a high average of 233. This is a first All-City selection for him.

Nelson was first in MDUSBC Open All-Events. In addition, he had six 300 games, one 299 game, three 800 series and a high average of 236 to complete the year. This is a first All-City selection for Nelson.

Zelechowski finished sixth in MDUSBC Open Doubles with Brent Calhoun. In addition, he won two Men's Series. Five 300 games, five 800 series and a high average of 231 completed his resume. This is Zelechowski's first time on the team.

Perry Crowell of St. Clair Shores (64), Eric Wayne of Chesterfield (64), Brian Thompson of Flatrock (63), Carleton Chambers of Detroit (61) and Jeffrey Austreng of Waterford (60.3) made the Men's All-City Second Team. Crowell is making his third appearance, Wayne, Thompson and Chambers their first and Austreng his 15<sup>th</sup>.

Reamy-Johnson with 86 points faired well in both local and state events. She finished sixth in the MDUSBC Women's Doubles Event with Ashley Denard along with third in both singles and All-Events in the same event. At the state level, she won the Michigan State Women's singles and finished sixth from MDUSBC in All-Events. Additional points were earned by finishing third in the MDUSBC Queens, tenth from MDUSBC in

the Michigan State Queens and winning one of the Women's Series events. One 300 game, one 279 game, three 700 series and a high average of 222 completed her resume. This marks the fifth appearance for Reamy-Johnson on the team.

Also on the women's first team were Stacy Timmer of Wayland (78), Cyndi Patterson of Taylor (65), Teresa Catchpole of Macomb (63) and Kimeyata Hollowell of Detroit (53).

Timmer was first in the MDUSBC Women's Doubles with Tanisha Burris as well as first in All-Events. In MDUSBC Women's singles, she finished fourth. In Queens competition, she finished sixth overall with MDUSBC and second from MDUSBC at the Michigan State USBC event. In addition, Timmer won one MDUSBC Women's Series event in the 2022-23 season. One 800 series and five 700 series along with a high average of 223 completed her resume. This is Timmer's second appearance on the team.

Patterson finished seventh in MDUSBC Women's Doubles with Lesia Lambert as well as second for singles in the same event. At the state level, Patterson finished third from MDUSBC at the Michigan State USBC Women's Open singles event and third overall for All-Events. Patterson finished with one 300 game, one 279+ game, eight 700 series and a high average of 217. This is Patterson seventh appearance on the team.

Catchpole finished fourth from MDUSBC at the USBC Women's singles event as well as second from MDUSBC in the same tournament for All-Events. She had a high average of 221, one 300 game, seven 279+ games and 14 series over 700. Catchpole is making her seventh appearance on the team.

Hollowell finished seventh from MDUSBC at the Michigan State USBC Women's singles event as well as first overall in All-Events. She recorded one 279+ game, nine 700 series and a high average of 220. Hollowell is making her first appearance on the team.

Ashley Denard of Southfield (49), Denisyha Waller of Shelby Twp. (44), Samantha Gainor of Chesterfield (42), Julie Halstead of Redford (42), and Cathleen Maes of Westland (39) made the Women's All-City Second Team. Denard is making her sixth appearance, Waller and Gainor their first, Halstead her fourth and Maes her first appearance on the team.

Austreng, 126 points, makes his third appearance on the Senior Men's Team. In Senior finishes, Austreng placed in the following positions at the MDUSBC Open Event: second in doubles, third in singles and first in All-Events. At the USBC Open, he was the top placing Senior from MDUSBC in singles. At the MDUSBC Masters, Austreng finished first for Seniors and at the MDUSBC Senior Masters he finished 22<sup>nd</sup>. Austreng finished in first place overall at the Michigan State Senior Masters. He recorded one 300 game, one 800 series and had a high average of 226.

The Senior Men's First Team was completed by Stephen Krywy of Sterling Heights (80), Kenneth Wyatt of Sterling Heights (73), Eric Wayne of Chesterfield (64) and Edward Mintz of Canton (60).

Krywy, making his second appearance, finished third among seniors in MDUSBC Doubles, fifth among seniors at the MDUSBC Masters, 29<sup>th</sup> at the MDUSBC Senior Masters, and second overall at the Michigan State USBC Senior Masters. Three 300 games, four 800 series and a high average of 226 finished his season.

Wyatt's senior finishes in the Michigan State USBC Open include: third in doubles with Steve Mraktitsch, second in singles and second in All Events. He finished 15<sup>th</sup> in the MDUSBC Senior Masters. Three 300 games, three 299 games and a high average of 232 marked his tenth appearance.

Wayne finished first overall in the Michigan State USBC Open doubles with Nicolo Curatolo. In addition, he had three 300 games, two 800 series and a high average of 230. This is his first appearance on the team.

Mintz senior finishes include first in the MDUSBC Open Doubles event and tenth for All-Events in the same event. Five 300 games, one 299 game, two 800 series and a high average of 230 mark his 11<sup>th</sup> appearance on the team.

Gerald Johnson of Taylor (49), Nicolo Curatolo of Dryden (44), Troy Stus of South Lyon (42), Steve Mraktisch of Howell (40) and Carl Harden of Livonia (38) rounded out the Senior Men's Second Team. Johnson earned his sixth appearance, Curatolo his first, Stus and Mraktisch their third and Harden his second selection.

Catchpole, 95 points, finished seventh among seniors in MDUSBC All Events. seventh among seniors from MDUSBC in Michigan State USBC Doubles, eighth among seniors from MDUSBC in Michigan State USBC Singles and second among seniors in All-Events. In USBC Women's Championship events, she finished second in singles and first in All-Events among MDUSBC seniors. In addition, Catchpole finished fifth in MDUSBC Senior Queens. One 300 and seven other high games, 14 - 700 series and a high average of 221 marked her seventh appearance.

Tanisha Burris of Holt (69), Sandra Schultz of Macomb (66), Lesia Lambert of Allen Park (57) and Toary Taylor of West Bloomfield (45) also earned first team nods.

Burris in her first round of doubles at the MDUSBC Women's event finished second among seniors. Other finishes among seniors in this event include fourth in singles and first in All-Events. Michigan State USBC Women Event finishes among MDUSBC seniors includes sixth in doubles and ninth in All-Events. She earned a title in winning the MDUSBC Queens and finished second in the MDUSBC Senior Queens. In addition, she had one 700 series.

Schultz finished first among seniors in the MDUSBC Women's doubles and singles as well as second in All-Events. Michigan State USBC Women's finish among MDUSBC seniors includes fifth in doubles. At the MDUSBC Queens, she finished sixth among senior competitors. She also finished sixth at the MDUSBC Senior Queens. One 300 game and a high average of 212 marked her eleventh appearance.

Lambert had the following senior finishes at the MDUSBC Women's event: third in singles and doubles as well as fourth in All-Events. At the Michigan State USBC Women's event, senior finishes include third in doubles and fourth in All-Events. She finished fourth among seniors at the MDUSBC Queens and fourth in the MDUSBC Senior Queens. Three 700 series and a high average of 208 mark her first appearance on the Senior team.

Taylor finished tenth among seniors at the MDUSBC Women's Doubles event and first at the Michigan State USBC Women's Doubles event. She finished third among seniors at MDUSBC Queens and first among MDUSBC seniors at Michigan State USBC Queens. Eight 700 Series marked her ninth appearance on the team.

Joining the second team were Michelle Berryman of Brighton (39), Pamela Jones of Livonia (38), Michelle Turner of Detroit (37), Kimberly Sisk of Brownstown (31), Deborah Murrell of Shelby Twp. (22) and Tonya Wilson of Detroit (22).

Points are tabulated on performance in the local, state and national tournaments; honor scores and league averages.
