TOARY TAYLOR CAPTURES MDUSBC SENIOR QUEENS AT WOODHAVEN BOWL-A-RAMA

Toary Taylor of Redford won the Metro Detroit USBC Senior Queens on Saturday with a 194-184 triumph over Pamela Wilson of Woodhaven at Woodhaven Bowl-A-Rama in Woodhaven.

Defending champion Taylor was the top qualifier for the stepladder finals with a four-game total of 850 on games of 231, 194, 203 and 222. As the top seed, she had to wait for the challenger to emerge. She took home the top prize of \$200.

Wilson qualified second with 847. She defeated Christine Wissinger of Clinton Township 234-220 to advance to the championship match. Wilson cashed for \$150.

Wissinger qualified third with 827 and defeated Deborah Murrell of Shelby Township 227-205 in the first match of the stepladder. Wissinger took home \$125 and Murrell \$100 for their efforts.

This was the 13th year of the MDUSBC Senior Queens. Initial qualifying was done by senior women 50 years of age and older with their actual all-events of the recently completed MDUSBC Women's Championship. The top bowlers advanced to the qualifying finals.

Other cashers for \$75 each were Jeanne Gebbia of Dearborn, Pam Jones of Livonia, Teresa Catchpole of Macomb, Patti Bryans of Warren and Krista Winbigler of Utica.

The MDUSBC Senior Queens Tournament is operated by the Metro Detroit USBC, which serves nearly 40,000 adult and youth bowlers in the Metropolitan Detroit market and is the largest local association of the United States Bowling Congress.
