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CROWELL, WALLER, SIKORA AND HALSTEAD CAPTAIN MDUSBC ALL-CITY TEAMS

The Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) has named their All-City teams for the 2024-25 season. The Metro Detroit USBC Association is the largest local association of the United States Bowling Congress with over 30,000 adult and youth members.

The teams include men's, women's, senior men's and senior women's teams based on tournament and league performance from August 1, 2024 through July 31, 2025. A complete list of criteria is available at mdusbc.com. Points are tabulated on performance in local, state and national tournaments; honor scores and league averages. Members must be 50 years or older on August 1, 2024 to be eligible for the senior team.

Perry Crowell IV of St. Clair Shores captains the men's team while Denisyha Waller of Shelby Twp., Gerald Sikora of Ecorse and Julie Halstead of Redford captain the women's, senior men's and senior women's teams respectively.

Men's All-City Teams:

Crowell earned 89 points by finishes in the following MDUSBC Open Championship, first in All Events and fourth in Singles. finished third highest as a bowler from MDUSBC in the Michigan State USBC Open Championship Doubles event with Jeremy Dixon; finished seventh in the MDUSBC Masters, finished as the highest bowler from MDUSBC in the national USBC Open Championship Singles event and rounding out his tournament play finishing highest again from MDUSBC in the national USBC Masters Championship. In completing his resume, Crowell had one recorded 300 game and a high average of 233 during league play. This marks the fifth appearance for Crowell on the All-City Team.

Rounding out the Men's first team are Jay Lang of Sterling Heights (79), John Kelley of Clinton Twp. (76), Timothy Bishop of Livonia (64), Corey Miller of Waterford (61.3).

Lang finished second in Doubles with John Buffa at the MDUSBC Open, was the highest bowler from MDUSBC and earned bonus points as the third highest of all teams in Doubles with Ronnie Sparks Jr. at the national USBC Open. In completing his resume, Lang rolled two 300 and one 299 games, four 800 series and had a high average of 238. This marks the ninth appearance for Lang on the All-City team.

Kelley finished third in Doubles with Ryan VanHecke at the MDUSBC Open and fifth at the MDUSBC Masters. In completing his resume, Kelley had four 300 games, six 800 series and a high average of 243. This marks the 10th appearance for Kelley on the All-City Team.

Bishop finished first of all bowlers at the Michigan State USBC Doubles event with partner Nick Hidalgo earning both first and overall bonus points. In competing his resume, he had three 300 games, two 800 series and a high average of 238. This marks the third appearance for Bishop on the All-City Team.

Miller finished first in the MDUSBC Masters and tied with two others for 10th in the MDUSBC Singles. In completing his resume, he had four 300 and one 299 games, one 800 series and a high average of 222. This marks the sixth appearance for Miller on the All-City Team.

Robert Rose Jr. of Melvindale (61), Gerald Sikora of Ecorse (61), Jeffrey Austreng of Waterford (60), Carter Milasinovich of Shelby Twp. (59.5) and Jeffrey Lizewski II of New Boston (57) made the Men's All-City Second Team. Austreng is making his 17th appearance on the All-City Team while Rose, Sikora, Milasinovich and Lizewski are all making it for the first time.

Women's All-City Teams:

Waller with 84 points finished first in Doubles with Akira Turner and sixth in All Events at the MDUSBC Women's Championship. At the Michigan State USBC Women's, she finished second from MDUSBC bowlers and earned bonus points for finishing third of all bowlers in Doubles with Clustelle Henry. In addition, she tied for third from MDUSBC in

singles, first from MDUSBC and third highest of all bowlers in All Events. In the MDUSBC Queen's event, Waller finished seventh. In completing her resume, Waller had one 300 game, two 700 series and a high average of 215. This marks the second appearance for Waller on the Women's All-City Team.

Rounding out the Women's first team are Victoria Giardina of Shelby Twp. (79), Julie Halstead of Redford (61), Candyce Bradley of Farmington Hills (59) and Nicole Wilson of South Lyon (58).

Giardina finished tied for eighth at the MDUSBC Women's Singles. At the Michigan State USBC, she finished sixth highest from MDUSBC in Doubles with Bailey Gipson, fifth highest in Singles and 10th in All Events from MDUSBC bowlers. Giardina finished 16th at the MDUSBC Queens and first from MDUSBC and third highest of all bowlers in the Michigan State Queens. In addition, she won two MDUSBC Turbo Cup Series events as well as being the Cup Champion. In completing her resume, she had two 300, one 299 and three 279 plus games, four 700s and a high average of 224. This marks the second appearance for Giardina on the Women's All City Team.

Halstead tied for third highest from MDUSBC bowlers at the Michigan State Women's Singles event. At the national USBC Women's, she finished first from MDUSBC bowlers in both Doubles with Kristin Truszkowski and All Events. In completing her resume, Halstead rolled one 299 and one 290 plus games, six 700 series and had a high average of 220. This marks the fifth appearance for Halstead on the Women's All-City Team.

Bradley finished fourth at the MDUSBC Women's Singles. At the national USBC Women's, she was third highest bowler from MDUSBC in Doubles with Alyssa Hall and second in All Events. In completing her resume, she had four 279 plus games, 10 700 series and a high average of 216. This marks the third appearance for Bradley on the Women's All-City Team.

Wilson finished fourth at the MDUSBC Women's Doubles with Brandie Reamy-Johnson. In completing her resume, she rolled three 300 and four 279 plus games, three 800 and five 700 series with a high average of 224. This marks the second appearance for Wilson on the Women's All-City Team.

Ashley Denard of Southfield (55), Josephine Bashara of Milford (51), Brandie Reamy-Johnson of Taylor (50), Kristin Truszkowski of Livonia (45) and Jenna Pollak of Fraser (44) made the Women's All-City Second team. This marks the seventh appearance for Denard and Reamy-Johnson, fourth for Pollak and first for Bashara and Truszkowski on the Women's All-City Team.

Senior Men's All-City Team:

Sikora, 94 points, makes his third appearance on the Senior Men's Team. In Senior finishes, Sikora placed in the following positions at the Michigan State USBC Open: fourth highest as a Senior from MDUSBC in Doubles with Nicky Hammons, third highest bowler from MDUSBC in Singles and earned bonus points as first place of all bowlers in All Events. At the MDUSBC Senior Masters he finished fourth and at the Michigan State Senior Masters he finished fifth highest from MDUSBC. In completing his resume, Sikora had three 300 games, two 800 series and a high average of 227.

The Senior Men's First Team was completed by Jay Lang of Sterling Heights (79), Jeffrey Austreng of Waterford (69), Gerald Johnson of Taylor (65) and Stephen Krywy of Warren (61).

Lang finished first highest as a Senior in Doubles with John Buffa at the MDUSBC Open, first from MDUSBC and earned bonus points as third overall in Doubles with Ronnie Sparks Jr. at the national USBC Open. In completing his resume, Lang rolled two 300 and one 299 games, four 800 series and had a high average of 238. This marks the first appearance for Lang on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Austreng finished fifth as a Senior at the MDUSBC Open in Doubles with Charles Easton and eighth in All Events. In completing his resume, Austreng rolled eight 300 games, six 800 series and a high average of 241. This marks Austreng's fifth appearance on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Johnson finished first from MDUSBC bowlers in the national USBC Open Singles event, first from MDUSBC and earned bonus points as the second place finisher of all bowlers in the Michigan State Senior Masters and third in the MDUSBC Senior Masters. In completing his resume, Johnson had a high average of 225. This is the seventh appearance for Johnson on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Krywy finished eighth as a Senior at the MDUSBC Open Doubles with Corey Miller as well as seventh in singles and second in All Events. At the Michigan State Senior Masters, Krywy finished third from MDUSBC. In completing his resume, he rolled two 300, one 299 and one 298 games and had a high average of 223. This marks Krywy's third appearance on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Kenneth Wyatt of Sterling Heights (60), Michael Calvin of Warren (60), Dominico Emmi of Macomb (54), Terence Dockery of Fraser (46), Edward Mintz of Canton (42) and Scott Bowersock of Dearborn Heights (42) made the Senior Men's All-City second team. This marks the 13th appearance for Wyatt, the fifth for Calvin, first for Bowersock and Emmi, second for Dockery and 12th for Mintz on the Senior Men's All-City Team.

Senior Women's All-City Team:

Halstead, 86 points, finished ninth as a Senior in MDUSBC Women's All Events. At the Michigan State Women's, she finished first from MDUSBC Senior bowlers in Singles. At the national USBC Women's, Halstead finished highest of Senior MDUSBC bowlers in Doubles with Kristin Truszkowski and first in All Events. In addition, Halstead won the MDUSBC Senior Queens. In completing her resume, Halstead rolled one 299 and one 290 plus games, six 700 series and had a high average of 220. This marks the second appearance for Halstead on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Rounding out the Senior Women's first team are Lesia Lambert-Conant (74), Sandra Schultz of Macomb (61), Angela Wilt of Westland (57) and Deborah Murrell of Shelby Twp. (45). This marks the second appearance for Lambert-Conant, 13th for Schultz, third for Wilt and sixth for Murrell on the Senior Women's All-City Team.

Lambert-Conant finished 10th as a Senior at the MDUSBC Women's in Singles and was the eighth highest finishing Senior in All Events. At the Michigan State Women's, she finished second as Senior from MDUSBC in Doubles with Cyndi Patterson, second in singles and first in All Events. In addition, she finished third highest as a Senior at the MDUSBC Queens and seventh at the MDUSBC Senior Queens event. In completing her resume, she bowled one 300 game and seven 700 series with a high average of 214.

Schultz's Senior finishes at the MDUSBC Women's include second in Doubles with Bailey Gipson and fourth in All Events. She finished as the highest placing Senior in the MDUSBC Queens as well as the highest finish as Senior from MDUSBC in the Michigan State Queens. In completing her resume, she had one 290 plus game, one 700 series and a high average of 211.

Wilt finished first as a Senior bowler in Doubles with Sarah Litteral, sixth in Singles and third in All Events at the MDUSBC Women's. At the MDUSBC Queens she finished second as a Senior, Michigan State Queens fifth as a Senior from MDUSBC and third at the MDUSBC Senior Queens. In competing her resume, Wilt had one 279 plus game and a high average of 208.

Murrell finished fourth highest in Singles and 10th in All Events as a Senior in the MDUSBC Women's. At the MDUSBC Senior Queens she finished fifth. In completing her resume, she bowled one 300 and five 279 plus games, nine 700 series and had a high average of 212.

Novella Daniels of Detroit (44), Michelle Berryman of Brighton (44), Teresa Catchpole of Macomb (35), Mary Cooper of Livonia (31) and Simonne Brown of Westland (30) made the Senior Women's All-City team. This is the first appearance for Daniels and Cooper, second for Brown, third for Berryman and ninth for Catchpole on the Senior Women's All-City Team.
