## **Justin Knowles repeats in MDUSBC Masters** Defeats Larry Walker in 2018 finals re-match

Justin Knowles of Okemos came out of the loser's bracket and won the Metro Detroit USBC Masters Tournament at AMF Rose Bowl Lanes in Roseville Sunday when he defeated Larry Walker of Garden City in a rematch from 2018. He defeated Walker 437-379 after beating him 501-439. Knowles took home the \$2,000 first prize and the title. Walker settled for the second place check of \$1,000. Knowles became the fourth back-to-back Masters champion.



Knowles was seeded ninth by tournament rule. qualifying with 1,266. In match play he defeated John Kelley of Clinton Township 522-406, Troy Stus of South Lyon

468-428, and Gary Schluchter of Fremont. Ohio 482-385 before falling to Conner Weber of Wayne 483-436. In the loser's bracket he beat JR Raymond of Clinton Township 483-366, Justin Neiman of Macomb 516-457 and avenged the earlier loss to Weber 478-429 to advance to the championship match. He averaged 232.9 for 24 games of competition.

He joins previous back-to-back Masters Champions Pat Iannucci (1975-76), Dick Beattie (1980-81) and Mark Moore (2003-04) in the 56year history of the event.

"After qualifying on Saturday I worked on my purple Hammer ball in preparation for match play." said Knowles. "When I got to the center this morning for match play the adjustment I made worked."

Walker qualified seventh with 1,335 and averaged 215.9 for 20 games. In match play he remained in the winner's bracket with triumphs over Ryan

Van Hecke of Chesterfield 413-386, Michael Lucente of Warren 504-422, Corey Miller of Waterford 375-374, Lonnie Jones of Ann Arbor 506-343 and Weber 384-382 and waited for a challenger to emerge.

Weber qualified fourth with 1,366. In match play he beat John Tovar of Waterford 366-297, Aaron Lorincz of Centerline 442-437, Justin Neiman 450-432, and Knowles 483-436 before falling to Walker 384-382. In the loser's bracket he fell to Knowles 478-429 ending his day. He averaged 217.7 for 18 games and took home the third place check of \$800.

Neiman qualified 12th with 1,290 including a high game of 242. In match play he beat David Rokicki of Warren 468-393 and JR Raymond 504-444 before getting knocked into the loser's bracket by Weber 450-432. Once in the loser's bracket he beat Terence Haines II of Pinckney 361-346, Van Hecke 484-400, and Lonnie Jones 458-410 before losing to Knowles 516-457. He averaged 224.2 for 20 games and took home \$600.

JR Raymond qualified fifth with 1,357 and took home \$500 for this fifth place finish. Lonnie Jones finished sixth for \$500, Kurt Pilon seventh for \$450 and Ryan Van Hecke eighth for \$450.

Top gualifier Matthew Coleman of Waterford led the field of 110 bowlers with 1,428 with a high game of 270. In match play he won his first match and then lost his next two matches and took home \$325 for his 17th place

#### Mykaela Mitchell and Lonnie Jones snag titles at Thunderbowl

Mykaela Mitchell of London, Ontario won the Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) Women's Series event Sunday with a 246-234 triumph over November winner Julie Oczepek of Vassar at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park. Mitchell took home the top prize of \$500, while Oczepek settled for \$250.

Mitchell qualified third in the field of 43, with a four-game total of 853. She started qualifying slowly with 185 before making a ball change, which resulted in 223 and 276 in the second and third games respectively. In match play she defeated Sarah Dorow of Midland 198-161 and last month's winner Valerie Bercier of Spring Lake 246-236 to advance to the finals.

Oczepek was the top qualifier with 888, on games of 201, 213, 197 and 277. She earned a bye in the first round, but once match play started she beat Sekeithia Walters-Wright of Eastpointe 183-151 and Kimberly Williams of Detroit 203-186 on her way to the finals.

Lonnie Jones of Ann Arbor won the MDUSBC Men's Series event Sunday with a 207-191 triumph over Gary Schluchter of Fremont, Ohio at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park. Jones took home the top prize of \$500, while Schluchter settled for \$250.

Jones qualified narrowly by one-pin in the eighth position in the field of 35, with a four-game total of 823 on games of 182, 189, 277 and 175. In match play he beat top seed Craig Johnson of New Boston 257-204, Stephen Krywy of Sterling Heights 188-179 to advance to the championship match.

Schluchter was consistent in qualifying with 834, including a high game of 215. In match play he beat Tim Mayer of Chesterfield 225-205 and Ernie Segura Jr. of Taylor 242-202 on his way to the finals.

In the points race, Darren Alexander leads the men and Valerie Bercier the women

The next event will be March 10 at Mayflower Lanes.

## End of season awards and scholarships

Each year the Metro Detroit USBC selects deserving individuals for a number of year- end awards. Those awards include the Secretary of the Year, Coach of the Year and Volunteer of the Year. Selections are made from the nominations received from anyone who sees a deserving person from within the association. All applications are due to April 1, 2017.

To be eligible for Secretary of the Year a person must be a current league secretary in the MDUSBC. To be Coach of the Year the coach must be a current youth coach in the MDUSBC.

To be considered for Volunteer of the Year a person must be a MDUSBC Board Member or Officer; or Association Representative Coordinator or Association Representative.

MDUSBC will award up to eight \$1,000 scholarships this year to four male and four female bowlers. Applicants must be at least 14 years of age and can only win once.

The scholarships are a result of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association, Detroit Women's Bowling Association and Pontiac Women's Bowling Association restricting funds for this purpose.

Applicants must write a minimum 100 word essay about their future educational plans and submit a completed application signed by their coach.

Applications must be submitted to the MDUSBC office by April 1, 2019. Applications can be obtained by calling the MDUSBC office or visiting www.mdusbc.com and clicking on forms.

### **Midwest Women's Tournament** returning to Michigan

This May and June the Michigan State USBC will be hosting the 7th annual Midwest Women's Tournament (MWT) in Battle Creek. This is the second time the tournament will come to the state. Michigan was the first stop on the six state rotation of this tournament and hosted the inaugural event. The first trip to Michigan for the MWT bowlers was in Lansing. Our state will kick off the second rotation of the tournament in May.

Michigan along with Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Ohio, and Wisconsin make up the MWT organization. Many years ago when the WIBC governed women's bowling the six states regularly compared notes at the annual meeting. Talk of a regional tournament was always a topic of conversation with the women of the Midwest region. Almost ten years ago the groundwork was laid for the first tournament. It was a draw of straws that brought the tournament to Michigan first.

The original concept of the MWT was for female bowlers to get a

This year's MWT is in Battle Creek and it will be held at the newly remodeled Bowlero Lanes (formerly Nottke's) and M-66 Bowl. The tournament is a short one hour and half away from most of the MDUSBC area. It is a mini national women's championship. Last year saw 22 states represented in the tournament. Many of the ladies who bowl in the MWT also bowl in the USBC Women's Championships.

## **Recreational or more?**

### **On The Lanes** With Shane Shane Ferris **MDUSBC** Director



This month I wanted to discuss what kind of bowler are we? If you are like myself, you look around your man/woman cave or whatever it is you have at your house and look at awards, trophies, rings and more and remember a time when you were really good at bowling. As we get older though, life happens. Family commitments, work, injury to name a few that change our level of competition. This has happened to myself as well. Others seem to stay at a high level even as they get older or even become better. One way or another there are a great deal of us that believe we are still really good at this game. But is that really the truth?

I often see it at the center I manage. A bowler that at one time or another truly was great at this game. Always 220 plus average, bowled 4 nights a week plus tournaments, routinely called for winning jackpots, always reading about them at tournaments and you knew when you bowled their team you were in for a battle. As time changes everyone, this same person now only bowls once or twice a week, never practices, seldom bowls tournaments and

their average has slipped quite a bit as well. But to talk with this person you'd never think anything has changed. This sometimes leads to a great deal of frustration as he or she has a bad night or nights on the lanes. This makes me believe that as we get older our knowledge of the game is still great maybe even better but for various reasons our ability to perform is quite another and sometimes hard to accept.

So the question becomes can we ever say and accept that we are just a recreational bowler? Or are we really so blind to believe that we can bowl 3 or 6 games a week and be as good as we once were let alone improve and get better? Now I know there is the conversation of today's technology that gives you an advantage and I believe that is true but is it enough to replace muscle memory and repetition all together? I don't personally believe so. So what you are left with is the definition of insanity. That is, to do the same thing over and over again and expect a different result. How many of us are there?

I can personally tell you that even managing a center I seldom practice. I find myself wanting to be home with my family more than stay late and practice. I do bowl 3 leagues a week and get in most of the jackpots and when I come up a strike short of winning a jackpot I go home frustrated. Sound familiar? What I come to realize after the fact is that we're only going to get out of this game what we put in to it. Regardless of age or experience. And if 3-6 games a week is all you can do, sure you'll have good nights but it will probably not be as consistent as it once was. And that's okay! Unless it's not okay with you. Then the only question left is, what are we going to do about it? Or more so, what are we going to do differently about it? I'll never claim to have all the right answers but I hope I've given you a different perspective.

## FOX kicks off successful PBA telecasts

Trying to compare viewership numbers for PBA TV shows on FOX and FSI to the viewership numbers on ESPN in previous years is somewhat akin to comparing apples and oranges.

That's because the PBA's deal with FOX Sports includes numerous rebroadcasts — 14 for the special PBA Clash that first aired Dec. 23 and 11 scheduled for the Hall of Fame Classic that first aired Jan. 6 — that boost viewership numbers, while ESPN rebroadcasts were rare.

The 2019 PBA Tour season-opening Hall of Fame Classic is a perfect example of how this works, with the re-broadcasts drawing hundreds of

thousands of more viewers to the 220,000 who watched the 2-hour live show at 10 a.m. Central time.

PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark said in a message exchange that two re-airs later on Jan. 6 drew 112,000 and 125,000 viewers, respectively. Many of those presumably were fans who didn't get a chance to see the live show.

And the several more re-broadcasts through the week on FS1 and FS2 will add many more viewers, Clark said, although with the 457,000 on Jan. 6, the show already almost surpassed the ESPN 2018 show average of 551,000 viewers.

Clark said that through the Clash show on FOX and re-airs on FS1 and FS2 and the Hall of Fame Classic airings on Sunday, 4,875,000 viewers have tuned in to watch the PBA on FOX, FS1 or FS2, which is up 73 percent over ESPN's reach through two events last year of 2,818,000 viewers.

The 90-minute Clash show averaged 1,768,000 viewers, the most viewers for a PBA Tour show since 2005. (The figure is not total number of viewers — it is the average amount watching at any one time and was based on the showing that started at 4:15 p.m. Central time after the NFL post-game show following the Packers-Jets game. And Nielsen numbers now consider all forms of viewing, including DVR recordings, Clark said.)

I cautioned fans not to make too much of the numbers since an NFL game was the lead-in, and the show's first airing was on FOX, not FS1.

For some perspective, ESPN is in 86 million U.S. households and FS1 in 84 million, while FOX is in about 120 million. (CBS Sports Network isn't rated by Nielsen and by most guesstimates is in perhaps 55-60 million.)

Even though FS1 has nearly the penetration of ESPN, ESPN has the higher average audience with far more high-profile programming than FS1, which occasionally posts big numbers with, for example, baseball playoff games.

The shows that will air originally on FOX obviously will draw bigger numbers than the shows that air originally on FS1 — the first is the taped Chris Paul Celebrity Classic on Super Bowl Sunday and the second is the live PBA Tournament of Champions a week later on Feb. 10.

Anyone getting too hung on the early numbers should consider that FOX Sports and the PBA have a 4-year deal and the first year is about building a product and brand that will pay off with higher ratings, more and better advertisers, and more sponsors in future years.

#### Robby Spigner and former PBA player Mike Fagan partner in purchase of Minnesota based bowling center chain

Robby Spigner is the son of USBC Hall of Famer Bill Spigner and his wife Barb, who were the long-time owners of Hawthorn Lanes in the north Chicago suburb of Vernon Hills. The prominent center, now a Brunswick Zone center, hosted numerous PBA Tour and PBA Regional events and other tournaments. Robby Spigner is managing partner at Canum Capital Partners in the Bay Area in California.

Mike Fagan retired from the PBA Tour to earn an MBA from the University of California-Berkley and has been working in corporate finance for MGM in Las Vegas.

They both served on the USBC Board of Directors, and now they're getting back into bowling together as partners in Triple Shift Entertainment LLC, which on Monday announced in a news release that it has acquired 10 bowling centers in the Minneapolis-St. Paul region from the Anderson Companies. Terms were not disclosed.

Founded in 1980, the Anderson Companies' bowling centers "have a decades-long history of engaging with their communities by providing dynamic family entertainment, with offerings that include bowling lanes, arcades, laser tag and more," the release states.

The centers include Andover Lanes (Andover), Classic Bowl (Coon Rapids), Colonial Lanes (Rochester), Concord Lanes (South St. Paul), The Mermaid (Mounds View), Park Grove Bowl (Park Grove), PINZ (Oakdale), Super Bowl (Ramsey), River City Extreme (Monticello) and Sun Ray Lanes (Saint Paul).

River City Extreme is a PBA50 Tour host center.

Spigner is the president and Fagan the director of business development of Triple Shift Entertainment.

"After evaluating investment opportunities in the bowling center space for several years, we are delighted to be entering the industry with an extraordinarily strong group of centers, which have been built through the integrity, dedication and expertise of the Anderson family," Spigner said in the release. "We hope to build on the centers' existing success by continuing the Anderson family's unparalleled focus on an outstanding customer experience and by exploring new opportunities to deepen the centers' integration into the larger bowling community through junior programming and professional tournaments."

Mike Anderson, who represents the second generation of the Anderson Companies' founding family, said in the release that "Triple Shift Entertainment shares my family's commitment to premier bowling center operations, and they have a deep understanding of the industry. I am confident that they will do a wonderful job carrying on my family's legacy. This is an exciting, positive development for the business and for its employees."

Fagan, whose five PBA Tour titles include two majors, said in the release that "This is an incredible opportunity to combine my love of the sport with my passion for business, and I'm looking forward to working with the Triple Shift Entertainment team to implement our ideas for improving and growing the business and the sport."

Greyrock Capital Group, a provider of mezzanine debt and equity to finance buyouts, recapitalizations and internal growth needs of middle-market companies, assisted in providing financing for the transaction.

"Greyrock is pleased to invest with Mr. Spigner for the second time, given his extensive industry-specific background, track record for hands-on operational improvement, and partnership oriented approach," Sam Snyder, Principal of Greyrock Capital Group, said in the release.

## When Bush 41 Went Bowl Expo-ing

As we know, there have been two father-and-son combinations to serve as Presidents of the United States of America: John Adams (1797-1801) and John Quincy Adams (1825-1829), and George H.W. Bush (1989-1993) and George W. Bush (2001-2009).

While all served nobly, only the Bushes can claim that after their presidencies were completed, they were invited to speak at International Bowl Expo. Bush 41's appearance came in 1998 at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, where in a rare head-to-head election for President of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America, Rex Haney defeated Ed Zitnik.

It was five and a half years after one of the most accomplished singleterm U.S. Presidents had been defeated in his re-election campaign by

Bill Clinton, his bid doomed by six words he forever wished he could have taken back: "Read my lips: no new taxes."

As America mourned in the days following Bush's passing on Nov. 30, those close to him recalled that it took several months for him to get over the sting of that loss. But he was back to his old affable self by the time he spoke at Bowl Expo. In fact, he began his presentation in typical fashion: by making fun of himself.

During the 1984 campaign for the White House as Ronald Reagan's running mate, Bush stopped by a bowling center in Milwaukee, donned a pair of house shoes, picked out a house ball, made his way to one of the center's approaches and took off.

When he got to the foul line, he took a tumble. Bush, a southpaw, had been given house shoes for a right-handed bowler. Naturally, the press corps traveling with him transformed his briefly prone body into a Kodak moment for all eternity.

To kick off his Bowl Expo keynote address, Bush said that he had been asked whether he'd be willing to do a little bowling while in Nashville. "I said, 'Hell, no, and here's why." He then had that memorable photo displayed on the auditorium's big video screens, ingratiating himself to the nearly 2,000 attendees, Republicans and Democrats alike.

Bush described himself and former First Lady Barbara Bush as "bowlers of little note but great enthusiasm" during their time at the White House, on trips to Camp David and for many years before that at bowling centers in West Texas.

He said he understood that bowling had changed quite a bit since he'd been introduced to the sport as a youngster, but that he was too smart to get involved in the raging controversy of the day. "After all my years in politics," he said, "I know better than to get into a 'wood versus synthetic' debate."

Bush noted it was his understanding that Charlie Brehob was about to become President Emeritus of the BPAA. "I know all about that sort of thing," he said. "The 'E' means 'out' and 'meritus' means 'damn well deserves to be."

Then it was on to topics that became familiar during the many eulogies offered in the days following Bush's passing — lessons he'd learned from his parents:

- "Don't always talk. Listen. Then help if you can."
- "Give the other guy credit."
- "Be fair. Be honest."
- "When somebody else is hurting, lift them up."
- "Don't brag about yourself."

Added Bush: "When I went on to become President of the United States, these same values played a big part in what made me tick."

About leadership, Bush said, "It's easy to lead when things are going well,

though it's never long before success leads to new challenges. The true test of a leader is how he or she responds under pressure — what they do when the chips are down."

Bush said that the five and a half years since he'd left office had "flown by," and during that time he had decided to take the advice of friends and no longer bash the national press that he felt had been very unfair to him.

But it wasn't easy, he said, because the activity was so much fun. Quitting required joining "Press Bashers Anonymous."

You might call it George H.W. Bush's version of the PBA.

P.S.: Do not expect this type of remembrance when Bush 43 passes away. When he sat down for a Q&A with then-BPAA President Cathy DeSocio at Bowl Expo 2014 in Orlando, he banned the media from the auditorium.

#### CHATTING WITH ANOTHER PRESIDENT

Several months after he resigned the Presidency, Richard Nixon had an office in New York. There, he was beginning to work on his memoirs, but was not doing interviews. Like our current President, he felt he had been treated poorly by the media.

We in the bowling community knew he was an avid bowler, so one day I decided to see if he might be willing to talk to me — strictly about bowling. I figured I wouldn't be able to get past his secretary, but what the heck.

As an accredited journalist, I was able to get his office number from the Associated Press. The next morning, I picked up the phone and dialed the number, prepared to plead my case to his secretary.

The phone was answered on the third ring, but not by a secretary. After the click, I heard that unmistakable voice: "Dick Nixon."

Flabbergasted, I remained silent for a moment, and then tried to calm down and act professional. President Nixon readily agreed to talk with me, and we went on to spend the next 15 minutes discussing bowling and football.



He told me that he'd typically used the White House lanes late at night to burn off the stress of the day.

At the end of the call, he actually thanked me — for keeping my word about talking only about bowling. (Adding football to the conversation had been his idea.) I felt pretty good about getting an interview that Mike Wallace, Barbara Walters, Dan Rather and so many others had been unable to get.

I then did something a journalist never does. I asked the person I was interviewing and going to write about for his autograph. I asked if I could mail him a copy of the PBA program book that featured him on the cover for him to sign.

He readily agreed. That autographed cover is currently on display at the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame in Arlington.

The journalist in me says I shouldn't be proud of it. But the bowler in me thinks it's pretty cool.
