Robert Sloma captures MDUSBC Senior Masters at Mayflower

Comes out of the loser's bracket to beat Kaczmarczyk twice for title

Robert Sloma of Jenison beat Peter Kaczmarczyk of Warren in the



final two-game match 555-465 to win the Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) Senior Masters title at Mayflower Lanes in Redford and take home the top prize of \$ 2 , 0 0 0 . Kaczmarczyk settled for the run-

ner-up check of \$1,000.

Sloma qualified fourth with 1,474 including a high game of 279. In match play he won his first match against James "Bo" Goergen of Sanford 435-385 before falling to Kaczmarczyk 425-404. In the loser's bracket he beat William Froberg of St. Joseph 471-439, defending champion William Kazmierski of Pinconning 495-424, Michael Snow of Windsor 465-421, Goergen the second time 443-412 and Larry Wilson of Detroit 500-485 to move into the championship match. Once in the championship match he avenged the earlier defeat to Kaczmarczyk 517-435 to set up the final match. He averaged 240 for 24 games of competition.

This is the highlight of my career." said first-time participant Sloma. "I've been bowling real well this year."

Kaczmarczyk qualified fifth with 1,459 with a high game of 298. He stayed in the winner's bracket with victories over Michael Harte of Farmington Hills 493-439, Sloma 425-404, Steve Kenyon of Grosse lle

479-469 and Wilson 458-387 as he waited for a challenger to emerge



from the loser's bracket. Once Sloma emerged from loser's bracket he lost to Sloma 517-435 and 555-465 to finish the day. Kaczmarczyk averaged 234.1 for

18 games

Wilson qualified 14th with total of 1,380 including a high game of 298. He remained in the winner's bracket with wins over Glenn Pilon of Trenton 473-445, Troy Stus of South Lyon 578-394, which included a 300 game, Joseph Krajenke of Clinton Township 460-422, Snow 514-460 before losing to Kaczmarczyk 458-487 and Sloma 500-485. He took home \$750 for his third place finish and averaged 237.6.

Goergen finished fourth for \$600 after qualifying 20th with 1,355. In match play he won his first match against Froberg 472-327 before falling to the loser's bracket with a loss to Sloma 443-412. Once in the loser's bracket he beat Pilon 489-418, Harte 419-393, Krajenke 414-358, top qualifier Robert Michaux Jr. of Detroit 535-476 and Kenyon 460-453 before losing to Sloma the second time 443-412. He averaged 224.6 for 22 games.

Kenyon finished fifth for \$400 and averaged 238.2. Michael Snow of Windsor finished sixth for \$400 and averaged 227.4. Michaux ended up seventh for \$350, averaging 236.3 and defending champion Kazmierski

took home \$350 for his eighth-place finish, averaging 225.1.

Harold Sullins of Chesterfield won the Super Senior competition for nonqualifiers 60 years of age and older. He defeated Edward Mintz of Canton 216-194 for the title. Sullins won \$200 for his efforts and Mintz walked away with a check for \$175.

The entire field averaged 209.8 in qualifying with the top 24 averaging 233.4. The match play average was 224.6

Top games of the tournament were 300 by Schluchter in qualifying and Wilson in match play.

2020 USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS IN RENO EXTENDED BY A WEEK

ARLINGTON, **Texas** - As the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships prepares for its return to Reno, Nevada, in 2020, competitors have shown their passion for The Biggest Little City in the World by filling nearly 92 percent of the originally scheduled competition days.

More than 9,400 teams already have registered for the event, and with nearly all squads sold out from May through the end of the tournament, USBC has added another week of squads in July.

The 2020 USBC Open Championships has been extended to July 12 (last team date July 11), making room for teams still interested in competing and seeing what the newly renovated National Bowling Stadium has to offer.

The event is returning to Reno for the first time since 2016 and was scheduled to run for 108 consecutive days from March 21 until July 6. The extra week will allow an additional 600 teams to experience the world's largest participatory sporting event and iconic 78-lane NBS.

The entry deadline for the event has been extended until May 15 to allow bowlers and captains to form teams and take advantage of added inventory. Captains can enter and pay online at BOWL.com/OpenChamp or call the tournament office at 888-910-2695.

AWARDS DEADLINE APPROACHING

Each year the Metro Detroit USBC Association selects deserving individuals for a number of year- end awards. Those awards include the Secretary of the Year, Coach of the Year and Volunteer of the Year. Selections are made from the nominations received from anyone who sees a deserving person from within the

association. All applications are due April 1, 2020.

To be eligible for Secretary of the Year a person must be a current league secretary in the MDUSBC. To be Coach of the Year the coach must be a current youth coach in the MDUSBC.

To be considered for Volunteer of the Year a person must be a MDUSBC Board Member or Officer; or Association Representative Coordinator or Association Representative.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

The MDUSBC will award up to eight \$1,000 scholarships this year to male and female youth bowlers. Applicants must be at least 14 years of age and can only win once.

The scholarships are a result of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association, Detroit Women's Bowling Association and Pontiac Women's Bowling Association restricting funds for this purpose.

Applicants must write a minimum 100 word essay about their future educational plans and submit a completed application signed by their coach.



Kim Kearney rejoins Team USA coaching staff

ARLINGTON, Texas – Kim Kearney, the women's bowling coach at North Carolina A&T, once again will be part of the Team USA program as an assistant coach.

A United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Silver coach, she first joined the Team USA staff in 2004 as a Junior Team USA assistant coach under Rod Ross. She became a collegiate coach in 2007, though she remained on the Junior Team USA staff, and then joined Ross on the International Training and Research Center (ITRC) staff in 2009. She was named a Team USA assistant coach the following year.

In her latest role, her main focus will be to work with the adult team at training camps and during international competitions, as needed.

"Team USA has been a part of my life for 30 years," Kearney said. "I'm appreciative of the opportunity to work with the best coaches in the world and certainly the best athletes."

She's excited to join a coaching staff that added seven assistant coaches in 2017.

"I love the idea that we have expanded the coaching staff, getting more people involved," Kearney said. "There are so many great coaches in the country, and the chance to learn from different people, different styles, is best for all of us."

Kearney has been the head coach of the North Carolina A&T women's program since 2016. In 2018, the Aggies won the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title for the first time in 14 years and earned a spot in the NCAA tournament.

Prior to joining the ITRC staff in 2009, Kearney was the head coach of the Delaware State women's bowling team, where she was named the 2009 National Tenpin Coaches Association (NTCA) Coach of the Year. She led the Hornets to their first NCAA tournament appearance in 2009.

Kearney is a USBC Hall of Fame member who won 10 professional titles in her career, including three majors. She was a two-time All-American at San Jose State and joined the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour in 1989, where she earned PWBA Rookie of the Year honors.

As a three-time Team USA member, she won gold medals in the 2009 Pan American Bowling Confederation (PABCON) Championships Masters and team events, and a silver medal in the 2009 World Bowling Women's Championships team event.

As with all Team USA assistant coaches, Kearney will be an independent contractor and not an employee of USBC.

Recipients selected for 2020 USBC National Recognition Awards

ARLINGTON, Texas – The recipients of the 2020 United States Bowling Congress National Recognition Awards have been determined by the USBC Board of Directors.

Dave Bowers of Cayce, South Carolina, was selected to receive the Helen Baker Award for Outstanding Association Service, Teri Haugh of Faribault, Minnesota, is the Joyce Deitch Unity Award recipient, and JoAnn West of New Braunfels, Texas, is the USBC Proprietor of the Year.

Each year at the USBC Convention, outstanding bowling leaders are honored for their contributions to the sport. This year's recipients, who were selected from submitted applications, will receive their awards in April at the 2020 USBC Convention in Las Vegas.

Bowers has been involved in bowling at the national, state and local for more than 40 years, starting as a league secretary/treasurer in 1973, before becoming a director with the Greater Columbia Bowling Association (GCBA) in 1976

Haugh, the Joyce Deitch Unity Award recipient, currently serves on the Minnesota State USBC board as the youth representative, a position she has held since 2015. She has been a coach and promoter of youth bowling in Minnesota and the upper Midwest for more than 30 years.

West, the USBC Proprietor of the Year, was the general manager of Fiesta Lanes until she retired in late 2019, though she continues to oversee the sales department at the center. The 36-lane center had 18 certified adult leagues with more than 1,000 adult members and two youth leagues with 200-plus bowlers, and West attended every league meeting in addition to actively recruiting new bowlers to join leagues.

2020 PWBA TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP SET FOR RICHMOND RACEWAY; QUBICA/AMF REMAINS PWBA NATIONAL SPONSOR

ARLINGTON, Texas – The 2020 Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) Tour Championship will take place at the Richmond Raceway Complex for the fourth consecutive year, with national tour sponsor QubicaAMF to build out four lanes for the event.

The 2020 PWBA Tour Championship is set for Sept. 7-9 at the historic Old Dominion Building at the Richmond Raceway Complex. The final major of the PWBA Tour season is part of Richmond Raceway's NASCAR Playoff Race Week.

BowlTV will livestream qualifying rounds on Sept. 7-8, and CBS Sports Network will have live coverage of the PWBA Tour Championship's semifinal rounds and title match on Sept. 9 at 8 p.m. (Eastern).

"The PWBA Tour Championship has become an integral part of the fan experience for our NASCAR Playoff Race Week," said Richmond President Dennis Bickmeier. "The historic Old Dominion Building is a great venue for bowling and race fans, so we look forward to welcoming back the 16 PWBA athletes competing in the world-class PWBA Tour Championship to the Richmond Raceway Complex this fall."

In addition to building the lanes for the PWBA Tour Championship, QubicaAMF returns as a title sponsor on the 2020 PWBA Tour.

The QubicaAMF PWBA Players Championship, a major event on the PWBA Tour, will be held Aug. 19-23 at Seminole Lanes in Seminole, Florida. This is the third consecutive year QubicaAMF has been the title sponsor of the event.

"QubicaAMF is proud to continue its involvement with the PWBA Tour, which gives women bowlers from throughout the world the opportunity to compete at the highest level," QubicaAMF Chairman Pat Ciniello said. "Our sponsorship of the PWBA Players Championship and building the lanes for the PWBA Tour Championship are part of our commitment to the sport and helping to showcase these outstanding athletes."

QubicaAMF is the world's largest manufacturer of bowling products, with its United States division headquartered in Richmond. It became a title sponsor of the PWBA Tour in 2017.

Richmond Raceway first played host to the PWBA Tour Championship, which brings together the top 16 performers of the season, in 2017. PWBA members who win a PWBA Tour event in 2020 will earn a spot in the PWBA Tour Championship, with the remaining spots in the field filled through the PWBA points list.

Bowling once again will be a major part of Richmond Raceway's fall race weekend as Go Bowling returns for the third consecutive season as the entitlement sponsor for the fall NASCAR Xfinity Series (NXS) race.

The Go Bowling 250, the NXS Regular Season Championship race, is set for Friday, Sept. 11, "under the lights" at Richmond Raceway. The race week continues with the Federated Auto Parts 400, the second race of the NASCAR Cup Series Playoffs, on Saturday, Sept. 12.

PWBA Tour Championship tickets will go on sale May 31. Tickets are \$25 for a three-day pass while individual tickets for the Sept. 9 finals are \$20. Tickets for preliminary rounds on Sept. 7-8, which will have two sessions each day, are \$10. FOUR HIGH SCHOOL BOWLING PROGRAMS RECEIVE GRANTS THROUGH THE YES FUND

ARLINGTON, Texas – High schools in Kentucky, Louisiana and Minnesota have been selected to receive a \$2,500 grant for their bowling programs through the Youth Education Services (YES) Fund.

Administered by International Bowling Campus (IBC) Youth Development, the High School Grant Program annually provides up to four grants to high schools to start a new bowling program or to assist existing programs in need of financial assistance because of budget cutbacks or other changes.

The schools selected to receive grants are:

Paducah Tilghman High School, Paducah, Kentucky

Warren East High School, Bowling Green, Kentucky

St. Augustine High School, New Orleans

Sibley East High School, Arlington, Minnesota

Paducah Tilghman High School's bowling program is in its inaugural year of being a school-sponsored sport, after a year as a club sport. In 2018, Kristi Miller, the team's coach, was asked to develop the bowling club after a Title IX survey showed a valid interest. She was told, "if the club grew large enough, that we would eventually look at developing a competitive team."

The club team drew 16 students, leading to the school approving a competitive team. The program now has 24 players, and receives some school funding. The grant will pay for additional equipment, tournament fees and travel expenses.

Warren East High School, which has a boys' and girls' team, has existed for many years. The school pays a coaching stipend but does not fund the program itself, so fundraising efforts cover additional costs.

"These kids are very dedicated," coach Patrick White said in the application. "They go in their off time and spend their own money (to practice). They also use their own equipment to practice and play with, as well."

Michael Templin not only is the coach for Sibley East bowling team, but bowled for the school. In 2012, his senior year, he worked to relocate the team to a new center, when its previous center closed, and he returned to coach the team in 2018. Players must pay a yearly fee to be on the team, which covers center costs and league fees.

The school has been self-sufficient and was thankful for donations from the Gaylord Fire Department Relief Fund and the Gaylord Protective League. It plans to use the funds to get new jerseys and bowling supplies.

St. Augustine High School competes in a high school warm-up league in the winter and varsity competition in the spring. The 10-week fall league pulls upwards of 55 schools from the New Orleans area in preparation of the varsity season.

Each bowler pays for winter season, their bowling jersey, and provides their own equipment. They will use the High School Grant to ease the costs of the fees for the varsity season, travel expenses, and additional equipment.

The High School Grant Program is a product of the YES Fund, a joint initiative of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and United States Bowling Congress The YES Fund is supported by the top bowling brands in the industry, including Bowling.com, Brunswick, Columbia 300, Ebonite, Hammer, QubicaAMF, Roto Grip, Storm and Track.

USBC NEWS: REPORT SHOWS USBC IS FULLY COMPLIANT WITH USOPC REQUIREMENTS

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC) published an audit report showing the United States Bowling Congress is fully compliant with the USOPC's 2019 Compliance Checklist

The USOPC 2019 Compliance Checklist reported USBC policies were compliant in the areas of governance/managerial, financial capability, due process and athlete representation, and anti-doping. The audit, which had 27 questions related to the four areas, was conducted by the USOPC Audit and Organizational Advancement Team.

USOPC stated, "There were no deficiencies found and USBC is fully compliant with the USOPC's 2019 Compliance Checklist."

Pursuant to the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act, member National Governing Bodies (NGBs) have agreed to comply with all conditions of membership as set forth by the USOPC's bylaws and policies. To ensure these policies are met, the USOPC conducts reviews and produces compliance checklist reports for all NGBs on an annual basis.

The USOPC 2019 Compliance Checklist report will be presented to the USOPC Athlete and NGB Engagement Committee.

Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Carol Gianotti, Pam Buckner elected to PWBA Hall of Fame for Class of 2020

FOX PBA ratings continue to skyrocket



Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Carol Gianotti and Pam Buckner have been elected to the PWBA Hall of Fame for the Class of 2020 by the PWBA Hall of Fame committee, PWBA announced.

The trio, who were selected in the Performance category and already were USBC Hall of Famers, will be inducted May 13 in Las Vegas, in conjunction with the 2020 USBC Queens. PWBA said details on the ceremony will be announced later.

The Class of 2020 is the second since the PWBA Hall of Fame was resurrected.

When only Leanne Hulsenberg and Wendy Macpherson were elected

to the resurrected PWBA Hall of Fame last year in the Performance cat-

There were far more than two sterling silver candidates to choose from, but if the Committee had elected all of them for 2019 what would that mean for future years: you wouldn't want to "use up" all of the eligible candidates and not be able to have a class in a future year, would you?

Donna Conners, founder of the famed Luci tournament, also was elected in the Meritorious Service/Builder category.

To be eligible in the Performance Category, a player needs at least 10 PWBA Tour titles, or at least five PWBA Tour titles with at least two being majors.

I noted that some obvious Performance candidates for 2019 included Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Hulsenberg, Macpherson, and Kim Adler — all members of the USBC Hall of Fame. Others like Liz Johnson, Michelle Feldman, Shannon O'Keefe, and Kelly Kulick.

After seeing that story, bowling historian Eric Hartman sent me an email noting other players with 10 titles or more who are 50 or older included Carol Gianotti, Cheryl Daniels and Sandra Jo Shiery. And Kim Terrell-Kearney joined that group when PWBA rightly decided to make the USBC Queens and U.S. Open wins during the PWBA dark years between 2003 and 2015 official titles.

And Hartman said players with at least five wins and two majors who are 50 or older are Buckner, Dede Davidson, and Marianne DiRupo.

At the time, I wrote that based on their resumes, Dorin-Ballard, Adler, and Gianotti are the most likely to be elected for 2020.

Dorin-Ballard, 55, won 20 PWBA titles from 1991 through 2003, including the 2001 USBC Queens. She was the 2001 PWBA Player of the Year after winning a record-tying seven titles (Patty Costello, 1976). She tied or broke 11 PWBA records that season, setting the record for most TV appearances in a season with 18.

In 2001 and 2003, she led the PWBA in earnings and average and was named the International Bowling Media Association Female Bowler of the Year.

The fiery competitor's 20 titles puts her in a tie for seventh with Wendy Macpherson.

"It's the icing on the cake for my career," Dorin-Ballard said in the PWBA release. "It's something I hoped I would be eligible for one day and be most fortunate to get there. But it's funny because when I bowled, I never really thought about hall of fames and I never thought about the money.

"I always just wanted to win. I always wanted to be the best. I didn't care what the trophy looked like and I didn't care what the check was. As I progressed in my career, you get to a certain point and you say, 'Wow, I got there.' I met a goal that I had as a little girl."

Gianotti, 52, has 16 PWBA titles, including the 1989 USBC Queens and 1996 Sam's Town Invitational. She won a career-best four titles during the 1992 season, which helped her earn Australian Sportswoman of the Year

honors in 1992 and 1993. In 1998, she won two titles and was named PWBA Player of the Year after leading the PWBA in earnings and average.

Gianotti was named the IBMA Female Bowler of the Year and Bowling Digest Female Pro Bowler of the Year in 1998.

"I'm very grateful and very honored," Gianotti said. "It's a dream come true for me because that's where it all started. I feel very over-whelmed and it tops off my career. I'm looking forward to the night and sharing it with the other inductees."

Gianotti later posted this on Facebook:"What a dream come to true to reach the highest achievement in the sport I love. Very honored and overwhelmed to be inducted into the PWBA hall of fame along with two other champions Carolyn Dorin Ballard and Pam Buckner. Thank you for all the messages cannot wait to celebrate this special occasion and thank the people that have helped me reach this dream."

Buckner, 73, won seven PWBA Tour title, including the 1975 PWBA Championships and the 1976 USBC Queens.

"It's an honor," Buckner said in the PWBA release. "It means everything. As an athlete, you go out, you work hard and do the best that you can and that's the highest honor in my estimation that any athlete can receive. I'm totally elated, very honored and very blessed to be elected to the PWBA Hall of Fame."

With the 2020 class, there are 41 membership of the PWBA Hall of Fame — 24 in Performance, 10 in Pioneer and seven in Meritorious Service/Builder.

The committee is comprised of three PWBA Hall of Fame members, three Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) board members, three USBC board members, and three media members (all not identified).

The 2020 PBA Tournament of Champions TV finals on FOX drew the highest viewership of any regular PBA Tour TV show since the historic 2010

PBA Tournament of Champions won by Kelly Kulick, according to ShowBuzzDaily.com.

The 2020 TOC aired live on FOX at 5 p.m. drew an average of 1,464,000 viewers measured in 15-minute increments during the 2-hour show, which is Nielsen's method.

The 2010 TOC average viewership was 1,765,000.

The 2020 TOC viewership was up 29.4 percent over the 1,131,000 viewers for the 2019 TOC, which aired live on FOX at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 10, 2019.

And it's well more than double the 644,000 viewers for the 2018 TOC on ESPN, which also was a live Sunday show.

Two shows did draw more viewers since 2010: the two special Clash shows that were on NFL Sundays on FOX and benefited hugely by being before or after NFL games depending on the market. The Dec. 23, 2018 Clash edged the 2010 TOC with an average 1,768,000 viewers, the most for a PBA Tour show since 2005, while the Nov. 1, 2019 Clash drew 1,481,000 viewers.

This year's TOC show likely benefited from following the Tampa Bay at New York XFL game on FOX, which drew 3,385,000 average viewers – not an NFL game audience but a solid number.

The PBA was head-to-head with the always popular PGA Tour Pebble Beach Pro-Am on CBS, which drew 3,505,000 average viewers, including 488,000 in the key 18-49 age category, and had a 2.27 rating.

The TOC almost matched Pebble Beach with 476,000 in the key 18-49 category, showing how old the PGA's audience skews. The TOC had a rating of 0.91.

The season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic live on FS1 at 1 p.m. on Sunday, Jan 19, which featured Tommy Jones winning the title with a perfect game, drew 304,000 average viewers, 55,000 in the prized 18-49 category, for a 0.22 rating.

The next two tournaments didn't draw the ShowBuzzDaily.com minimum audience of 300,000 average viewers to be listed in its weekly sports ratings roundup, and also didn't make its daily roundup for either Sunday, Jan. 26 or Saturday, Feb. 1.

The USBC Rules department busts some of the most common myths about rules and their interpretations

MYTH #57: By checking House/Standard lane condition on the League Certification Application my league is not a Sport or Challenge league, even though we use a tough lane condition.

BUSTED: A league using a challenging condition that is not certified as a Sport or Challenge lane condition, is still a Sport or Challenge League. As of August 1, 2017, Chapter 5 of the USBC Playing Rules & Commonly Asked Questions is called Lane Condition Designation. Each league is now required to select a lane condition on the League Certification Application. If the box is not checked, the local association or USBC Headquarters may change the league designation to Sport or Challenge. Sport and Challenge lane conditions refer to oil patterns designed for league and tournament bowlers who want to compete on more difficult conditions. However, lane condition is not the only factor used to determine if a league is a Sport or Challenge league. USBC compares averages of bowlers who bowl in more than one league for every certified league. The data is a key factor in determining whether a league is Challenge or Sport. Sport lane conditions are the same type of lane conditions used on the professional level and in international competitions. A few things to note about Sport and Challenge conditions:

Sport patterns typically have an oil ratio of 4:1 or lower.

Averages established in a Sport league are generally 20 pins lower than those established in a Standard condition league.

Challenge lane conditions typically have an oil ratio of 4:1 to 8:1.

Averages established in a Sport league are generally 10 pins lower than those established in a Standard condition league.

Standard or "house" patterns used in many leagues typically have an oil ratio of 8:1 or higher.

The lower the oil ratio, the more difficult the pattern.

Patterns have different shapes.

Averages for leagues who bowl on Sport or Challenge conditions are to be re-classified based on the respective conversion chart.

MYTH #58: Our league is using a tougher shot than the normal house shot but not the Sport patterns available on BOWL.com so the league is not a Sport league.

BUSTED: A league bowling on any condition that is more difficult than a typical house shot is considered a Sport or Challenge league. Basically, if the league has asked the bowling center to make the lane conditions more difficult in any way the Sport or Challenge box on the certification application must be checked. Your league officers are responsible to ensure the proper lane condition was checked for your league.

MYTH #59: The league president must call a meeting if I ask for one.

BUSTED: Unless your request or protest is in writing an officer is not required to hold a meeting. When a meeting request is relative to an alleged rule infraction or a decision made by a league officer, a written protest must be filed as follows:

- 1. 15 days of the event during the regular schedule
- 2. 72 hours if the games challenged occurred on the last session of a segment or in the final two weeks of the season or a playoff.

MYTH # 60: A team must earn points for all forfeitures.

BUSTED: Teams must earn points when they are bowling in a known forfeit situation, but not in unknown forfeit situations. The most common situation for a known forfeit is when a team lacks a legal lineup or fails to appear at all. An unknown forfeiture occurs when a team is unaware of a rule infraction and an officer or the board of directors issues a forfeiture of the game or games after competition has been completed. When this occurs, points are not earned; they are automatically awarded to the opposing team.

MYTH # 61: When a team that is granted a postponement does not bowl, the team that was present must earn the points by bowling their team average less ten pins per player.


BUSTED: When a team bowls knowing the opponent was granted a postponement, the team believes the scores bowled will be matched to the post-bowled scores to determine wins and losses. If the team granted the postponement does not bowl the scheduled make-up, the games are forfeited and the opposing team receives all the points. This is an unknown forfeit.

MYTH #62: If the treasurer is absent, a member on his/her team may handle the league funds.

PLAUSIBLE: League officers, (president, vice president, secretary treasurer and sargent at arms) are covered under the USBC bonding insurance.

Team mates who are not officers in the league are not covered by the insurance policy. The treasurer should ask another league officer to collect the league funds in his/her absence.

The History of One of Bowling's Most Storied Tournaments



I'm a sports fan, and that means I love stats. And I really love stats about sporting events that have stood the test of time. In the world of bowling, one tournament with a truly storied history is the QubicaAMF World Cup.

The Cup has been around for fiveand-a-half decades, and each year it brings together one man and one woman each from most of the world's countries — and virtually every country that has at least one bowling center.

In the 55 years that AMF and now QubicaAMF have conducted the Bowling World Cup — the first seven for men only, and all others for both men and women — bowlers from the United States have won a total of 20 titles.

Shannon Pluhowsky is the only American player to capture two titles, and she came within one match of nabbing a third during the 2015 World Cup in Las Vegas.

Canada ranks second on the nation list with 10 titles, followed by Australia with nine and the Philippines with seven. Finland and Norway have claimed five titles apiece.

Among individual bowlers, Paeng Nepomuceno of the Philippines is the all-time titles leader with four. No other bowler has won as many as three World Cup championships.

I've compiled some stats about the tournament, including the number of titles won by country, and the champions by country. You'll likely recognize quite a few of the names, while there probably are just as many or more of which you've never heard.

But even for the "one-time wonders," winning a World Cup title is something nobody can ever take away. And besides possessing a trophy they can proudly display, they'll always be a part of the statistical history of one of bowling's most famous global tournaments.
